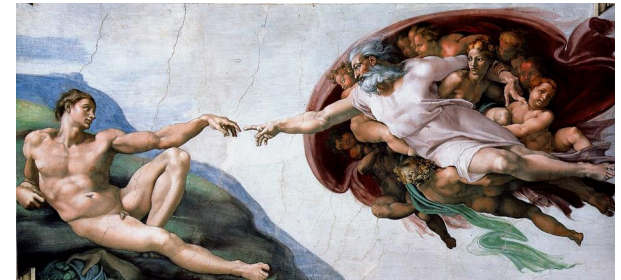
REGISTRATION FEES & DONATIONS
