

Coro Dolce Concert

Six years ago, under the direction and musical inspiration of Carl Mathis, (who in his previous life was a music professor at UPEI), Coro Dolce, PEI's stellar classical choir, was born. This year, the choir's repertoire is music written for the church. Some examples of the music to be enjoyed by concert-goers this season are: Mozart's "Ave Verum Corpus"; Fauré's "Cantique de Jean Racine"; Brahms' "How Lovely is Thy Dwelling Place"; the Antiphon "Tota Pulchra Es" by Bruckner; and what has become the choir's signature piece, the lovely "Lux Arumque" by Eric Whitacre. On July 26, Coro Dolce performs at St. Peter's Cathedral in Charlottetown. The concert begins at 7:30pm and admission is by donation. Not only is this an opportunity to hear some excellent classical music performed by an auditioned choir; it is also a chance to help the church, as Coro Dolce shares the door with the co-operating church organizations.
