Welcome Back Josh!

As some parishioners may have noticed, Joshua Smith is working with us for a second summer. Last summer, Josh prepared research materials on All Souls' Chapel, and this year he will be developing media materials on architect William Critchlow Harris and his famous brother, Robert Harris - often referred to as the Confederation painter. Construction

Parishioners should notice that some long overdue repairs and restoration to the Cathedral and Chapel will be taking place over the next several weeks. Jake de Fonseca of MBS Construction will be doing the work. Jake is well known to many parishioners for the excellent work he had done for St Peter's in the past. The main project will involve repairs to the east wall (facing the parking lot). It will include some repairs to the foundation, and repair and repointing of the brickwork. Also, repairs will be made to the foundation under one corner of All Souls' Chapel. These projects will cause some disturbance, so the support, patience and cooperation of parishioners is appreciated.

Coro Dolce Concerts

This summer, Coro Dolce, an auditioned classical choir from PEI under the direction of Carl Mathis, is marking Canada's 150 birthday, with four concerts showcasing vocal music from the 19th century:

Sunday, **July 16** at St. Peter's Cathedral in Charlottetown; Sunday, **July 23** as part of the concert line-up at the Bonshaw Community hall; and Sunday, **July 30** at St. George's Anglican Church in Montague.

Some musical highlight concert-goers will enjoy this season are: "In Stiller Nacht" and "Wie Melodien" by Brahms. "Evening" and "Echoes" by Sir Arthur Sullivan (of Gilbert & Sullivan fame); "Cantique de Jean Racine" by Fauré - a choir favourite; excerpts from Sir Andrew MacPhail's "Wallpaper Music", plus other delightful music from the mid to late 1800's. The concerts, except for Bonshaw which is an afternoon event, begin at 7pm; admission is by free-will offering.

Prince of Wales College Reunion

A reunion for alumni of Prince of Wales College will be held on Friday, July 28. The reunion will begin with a luncheon at UPEI at 12 noon. The alumni will then move to the Florence Simmons Performance Hall at Holland College for a reception followed by a program of story and song, emceed by Alan Buchanan. JULY 20th MARGARET OF ANTIOCH, in what is now Turkey, is celebrated as a saint by the Roman Catholic and Anglican Churches, on July 20 and on July 17 in the Orthodox Church. Her historical existence has been questioned for lack of evidence. She was declared apocryphal by Pope Gelasius I in 494, but devotion to her continued in the East and revived in the West with the Crusades.

According to legend, she was the daughter of a pagan priest named Aedesius. Her mother having died soon after her birth, Margaret was nursed by a pious woman, five or six leagues from Antioch. Having embraced Christianity and consecrated her virginity to God, she was disowned by her father, adopted by her nurse and lived in the country, keeping sheep with her foster mother. Olybrius, Governor of the Roman Diocese of the East, asked to marry her but with the price of her renunciation of Christianity. Upon her refusal she was cruelly tortured, and put to death in A.D. 304, during the persecution of the Church by the Emperor Diocletian.

JULY 22nd MARY MAGDALENE travelled with Jesus as one of his followers. Within the four Gospels she is named at least 12 times, more than most of the apostles.

She is most prominent in the narrative of the crucifixion of Jesus, at which she was present. She was also present two days later, immediately following the Sabbath, when, according to the Gospels, she was the first to testify to the resurrections of Jesus, as well as the first person to see Jesus after his resurrection and so she was called by the early church, "Apostle to the Apostles", The One Sent to The Ones Sent.
