

Cemetery Notes

During the current heat wave, parishioners who visit the cemetery will find it to be a cool and restful place to spend a few moments in quiet reflection and prayer. A new sign, which is clearly visible from the road, now greets visitors. Many thanks are due Elizabeth Reagh and the Costain family for covering the cost of constructing and installing the sign. The old sign has been taken down and flowers have been planted in the planter that supported it. Also two holly bushes have been planted under the new sign to add to its appearance. Thanks to Kristina Chandler for looking after the flower bed in the old planter and to Larry Arsenault for managing the water system.

At this time, the Cemetery Committee would like parishioners to consider ways in which they can support the maintenance and upgrading of this sacred place. Over the past few years costs have increased and currently we spend over \$4000. each year on the cemetery. Funding for cemetery maintenance comes from three different sources. First, from investment income earned in a Designated Trust Fund; second, from donations to the Cemetery Maintenance Fund; and third, from the sale of burial plots. In the last case, \$100. of every plot sold is added to the income side of the budget. Since investment returns have been low in the current economic climate, the major sources of income continue to be contributions to the Cemetery Maintenance Fund and plot sales. Therefore, the Committee appreciates very much memorial gifts donated by family and friends. Also, parishioners are encouraged to think about the needs in the cemetery as they plan the disposition of their estates.

Again this year, Mike Brazil and his assistants are looking after maintenance needs. As indicated in previous notes, the repair and restoration of grave stones is the responsibility of family members. Mike Brazil has many years of experience in this field, so please call him at 902-368-7330, if you require his services. Mike also has expanded his business to include monument sales. Again, he can be contacted at the number given above if you wish to consult on the purchase of a monument. Finally, **please contact Jack Stewart, if you wish to purchase a plot.**

St Peter's Cemetery Committee

AUGUST 13th HIPPOLYTUS, DOCTOR AND BISHOP (170-235), was the most important 3rd-century theologian in the Christian Church in Rome, where he was probably born. He is described in the early Church, as a disciple of Irenaeus, who was said to be a disciple of Polycarp, who was in turn a disciple of John the Apostle. He is remembered especially today as the author of the Apostolic Tradition, one of the earliest descriptions of Christian worship, which shows a remarkable continuity in the content and structure of the liturgy.

AUGUST 13th JEREMY TAYLOR, BISHOP (baptized 15 August 1613 - 13 August 1667) was a clergyman in the Church of England who achieved fame as an author during the Protectorate of Oliver Cromwell. He is sometimes known as the "Shakespeare of Divines" for his poetic style of expression, and he is frequently cited as one of the greatest prose writers in the English language. E.G. This prayer which is included in the Book of Common Prayer page 599:

O God, whose days are without end,
and whose mercies cannot be numbered:
Make us, we beseech thee,
deeply sensible of the shortness and uncertainty of human life;
and let thy Holy Spirit lead us in holiness and righteousness,
all our days;
that, when we shall have served thee in our generation,
we may be gathered unto our fathers,
having the testimony of a good conscience;
in the communion of the Catholic Church;
in the confidence of a certain faith;
in the comfort of a reasonable, religious and holy hope;
in favour with thee our God, and in perfect charity with all
men. Grant this, we beseech thee, through Jesus Christ our
Lord. *Amen.*
