



NEXT SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 2, CANDLEMAS also known as **The Presentation of Christ and the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** Our worship next Sunday both morning and evening recalls the visit of the infant Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem 40 days after his birth. Two elderly people, Simeon and Anna, met him and declared his coming as the fulfilment of prophecy. The earliest account of worship in Jerusalem describes the whole city moving in a procession with lighted Candles, so that it turned the night into day recalling both Simeon's words that Christ would be a light to enlighten the nations of the earth and our call to follow him. The whole congregation is invited to join the procession. The term "Candlemas" (or Candle Mass), refers to the practice of blessing candles for use in the Church throughout the year.

RECEIVING THE SACRAMENT

The church father Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem, 350-386 A.D. describes the manner of receiving the sacrament, to the newly baptized, using all of the senses, which includes **"hallowing the eyes"**. **"In approaching therefore, come not with thy wrists extended, or thy fingers spread; but make thy left hand a throne for the right, as for that which is to receive a King. And having hallowed thy palm, receive the Body of Christ, saying over it, Amen. So then after having carefully hallowed thine eyes by the touch of the Holy Body, partake of it; giving heed lest thou lose any portion thereof."**

When approaching the rail, if the right side is empty, go as far to the right to fill up that side the rail. If the left side of the rail is empty, please go to the far left so you do not force people to walk over your legs.

Kneel at the rail or stand, if you are unable to kneel. Remain with your hands folded until you are approached by the person administering the Sacrament, both Bread and Wine, when you might sign yourself with the sign of the Cross, a reminder that by this Holy Mystery you become one with Christ. Put your right hand in your left and the person administering the sacrament will place the host in the palm of your right hand. You may also receive the host directly on your tongue. If you wish to receive by intinction (dipping the host in the wine) please hold the host so that the person administering the wine may dip the host in the wine. This will limit the numbers of fingers in the chalice.

When receiving the wine please hold the base of the chalice, and the person administering the wine will help guide it safely to your lips. As a courtesy to the other people communicating after you, please do not put your fingers on the cup or lip of the chalice. If you do not wish to receive, please fold your arms across your chest and the person administering the chalice will repeat the first half of the words of administration.

When leaving the rail, please do not walk over the legs of other communicants. If they happen to be in your way, please wait for them to stand up and leave before you.
