Dear Friends:

It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the church with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

We continue to observe the protocol direction of the Chief Public Health Officer. Stay safe and keep others safe. Sanitize your **HANDS**. Cover your **FACE** with a mask. Keep a **SPACE** of six feet from anyone outside your household.

The offering plate will not be circulated. It will be available near the door of the church.

The Celebrant will wear a mask when delivering the sacrament in one kind. For the time being, only the celebrant will receive the wine. The Sacrament will be administered at the Chancel step into the hands of each communicant. Please return to your seat by the side aisle.

You may join in singing, if you are wearing a mask and standing the required distance of 2m or 6 feet apart.

World Day of Prayer 2021

Please plan to attend the World Day of Prayer Service hosted by Trinity Clifton United Church, Prince Street in Charlottetown, on Friday March 5, 2 p.m. (Storm date - Tuesday, March 9, 2 p.m.) The focus this year is on the Country of Vanuatu, and the theme is "Build on a Strong Foundation." A video of the service, written by the women of Vanuatu and prepared by the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada (WICC) will be shown. Offerings will go to WICC to support their grant program and their maintenance of World Day of Prayer. Tax receipts will be issued for donations of \$20 or more if your name and address are included. MARCH 1st DAVID OF WALES (c. 500 — c. 589) was a Welsh bishop of Menevia during the 6th century. He is the patron saint of Wales. His best-known miracle is said to have taken place when he was preaching in the middle of a large crowd at the Synod of Brefi: the village of Llanddewi Brefi stands on the spot where the ground on which he stood is reputed to have risen up to form a small hill. A white dove, which became his emblem, was seen settling on his shoulder. John Davies notes that one can scarcely "conceive of any miracle more superfluous" in that part of Wales than the creation of a new hill. David is said to have denounced Pelagianism during this incident and he was declared archbishop by popular acclaim. St David's metropolitan status as an archbishopric was later supported by Bernard, Bishop of St David's, Geoffrey of Monmouth and Gerald of Wales.

The Monastic Rule of David prescribed that monks had to pull the plough themselves without draught animals, must drink only water and eat only bread with salt and herbs, and spend the evenings in prayer, reading and writing. No personal possessions were allowed: even to say "my book" was considered an offence. He lived a simple life and practised simplicity, teaching his followers to refrain from eating meat and drinking beer. His symbol, also the symbol of Wales, is the leek (this largely comes from a reference in Shakespeare's Henry V, Act V scene 1) : Fluellen: *"If your Majesty is remembered of it, the Welshmen did good service in a garden where leeks did grow, wearing leeks in their Monmouth caps, which your Majesty knows, to this hour is an honourable badge of the service, and I do believe, your Majesty takes no scorn to wear the leek upon Saint Tavy's day". King Henry: "I wear it for a memorable honour; for I am Welsh, you know, good countryman"*

MARCH 2nd CHAD MISSIONARY and BISHOP (died 2 March 672) was a prominent 7th century Anglo-Saxon churchman, who became abbot of several monasteries, Bishop of the Northumbrians and subsequently Bishop of the Mercians, in central England. He features strongly in the work of the Venerable Bede and is credited, together with his brother, Cedd, with introducing Christianity to the Mercian kingdom.
