**Dear Friends:**

It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the church with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

### Food Bank Sunday - February 21, 2021

Parishioners of St. Peter's are asked to support the Charlottetown and area Food Bank in the spirit of helping those with the most basic of human needs, on the third Sunday of each month. Chunky soup is the requested item for February.

### Pre-Lent

Today is the second Sunday of the three Sundays of the Season of the Church Year called Pre-Lent. This is the season of the "Gesimas", that is, Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima, the Sundays that are respectively seventy, sixty and fifty days before Easter (approximately). In this season, there is a sort of "sea change" as we begin to turn our thoughts away from joyous celebrations of the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons, with their focus on the birth and manifestation of Christ, and toward the penitential season of Lent, with its focus on our Lord's Suffering and death. Throughout Pre-Lent and Lent, the singing or saying of "Alleluia" is omitted during our church services. In Pre-Lent, the colour of the liturgical vestments and altar frontal changes from green to purple, giving us a visual cue that it is time to begin to prepare ourselves for Lent, the season of penitence and self-examination, but also the season of hope, as we look forward to the resurrection of Christ at Easter.

**SHROVE TUESDAY.** Unfortunately because of Covid 19 Restrictions we cannot have our annual Pancake Supper this year. We all look forward to an end to the Pandemic and the possibility of Pancake Suppers of the future.

### Prayer Fasting Almsgiving

**PRAYER** Consider a time, for personal prayer, however brief or long. Make a plan to join in the daily worship offered in the Chapel. Choose a day and dedicate a half hour to living in the presence of God. In addition to the regular schedule

Friday Evensong will be followed by the Stations of the Cross, following Jesus' walk from his trial to his burial.

**FASTING** Give something up and take something on. If you give up time wasted, use the time for something better e.g. Give up a coin a day and fill in a Lenten Coin Card.

**ALMSGIVING** Make a point of giving to those in need, whether through the Lenten Coin Cards, (which requires a daily discipline of fasting) the Rector's Discretionary Fund or a Charity of your choice
