GOING FORWARD

Dear Friends in Christ:

While it is now possible to worship and to gather for meetings and coffee et cetera without capacity limits or masks in the Cathedral, please continue to sanitize your hands, to wear a mask or continue social distancing at your discretion. Please consider wearing a mask when moving in the aisle.

The Offering Plate will continue to be available by the door of the Cathedral.

For now, the Sacrament will continue to be delivered in one kind at the head of the nave, but it is my intention to restore the common cup at the Eucharist in the Cathedral and all Souls' Chapel. I can assure you that to the best of my knowledge, there is no evidence of the transfer of any disease through the use of the common cup since it was introduced at the time of the Reformation of 1549. Each Sunday since I was ordained in 1983, I have, Sunday by Sunday and day by day, consumed any wine left over, after everyone present consumed the wine from the common cup, as have the clergy throughout the Anglican Communion, these many years, with no evidence of resulting illness. Of course, you may continue to receive in only one kind. The cup will be offered. You are not obliged to consume the wine.

MAY 30th JOAN OF ARC (6 January c 1412-30 May 1431), "The Maid of Orléans", was born to Jacques d'Arc and Isabelle Romée, a peasant family, at Domrémy in north-east France. Joan said she received visions of Archangel Michael, Saint Margaret and Saint Catherine of Alexandria instructing her to support Charles VII and recover France from English domination late in the Hundred Years' War. The uncrowned King Charles VII sent Joan to the siege of Orléans as part of a relief mission. She gained prominence after the siege was lifted only nine days later. Several additional swift victories led to Charles VII's coronation at Reims. This long-awaited event boosted French morale and paved the way for the final French Victory.

On May 23, 1430, she was captured at Compiègne led by the Burgundian faction, which was allied with the English. She was later handed over to the English and put on trial by the pro-English Bishop of Beauvais Pierre Cauchon on a variety of charges. After Cauchon declared her guilty she was burned at the stake on 30 May 1431, dying at about nineteen years of age. In 1456, an inquisitorial court authorized by Pope Callixtus III examined the trial, debunked the charges against her, pronounced her innocent, and declared her a martyr.

JUNE 1st JUSTIN MARTYR (100-165), was an early Christian apologist, and is regarded as the foremost interpreter of the theory of the Logos (Christ as God's *Word* made flesh, John 1.14) in the 2nd century. He was martyred alongside some of his students. Most of his works are lost, but two apologies and a dialogue did survive. The First Apology (*argument in defence*), his most well known text, passionately defends the morality of the Christian life, and provides various ethical and philosophical arguments to convince the Roman emperor, Antoninus, to abandon the persecution of the fledgling sect. Further, he also indicates, as St Augustine did regarding the "true religion" that predated Christianity, that the "seeds of Christianity" (manifestations of the Logos acting in history) actually predated Christ's incarnation. This notion allows him to claim many historical Greek philosophers (including Socrates and Plato), in whose works he was well studied, as unknowing Christians.
