GOING FORWARD

Dear Friends in Christ:

While it is now possible to worship and to gather for meetings and coffee et cetera without capacity limits or masks in the Cathedral, please continue to sanitize your hands, to wear a mask or continue social distancing at your discretion. Please consider wearing a mask when moving in the aisle.

The Offering Plate will continue to be available by the door of the Cathedral.

For now, the Sacrament will continue to be delivered in one kind at the head of the nave, but it is my intention to restore the common cup at the Eucharist in the Cathedral and all Souls' Chapel. I can assure you that to the best of my knowledge, there is no evidence of the transfer of any disease through the use of the common cup since it was introduced at the time of the Reformation of 1549. Each Sunday since I was ordained in 1983, I have, Sunday by Sunday and day by day, consumed any wine left over, after everyone present consumed the wine from the common cup, as have the clergy throughout the Anglican Communion, these many years, with no evidence of resulting illness. Of course, you may continue to receive in only one kind. The cup will be offered. You are not obliged to receive the consecrated wine.

MAY 19TH DUNSTAN, Archbishop (c.909-19 MAY 988) was an English bishop. He was successively Abbot of Glastonbury Abbey, Bishop of Worcester, Bishop of London and Archbishop of Canterbury, later canonised as a saint. His work restored monastic life in England and reformed the English Church. His 11th-century biographer Osborn, himself an artist and scribe, states that Dunstan was skilled in "making a picture and forming letters", as were other clergy of his age who reached senior rank. Dunstan served as an important minister of state to several English kings. He was the most popular saint in England for nearly two centuries, having gained fame for the many stories of his greatness, not least among which were those concerning his famed cunning in defeating the devil.

That he was heard three miles or more.**
