GOING FORWARD

Dear Friends in Christ:

While it is now possible to worship and to gather for meetings and coffee et cetera without capacity limits or masks in the Cathedral, please continue to sanitize your hands, to wear a mask or continue social distancing at your discretion. Please consider wearing a mask when moving in the aisle.

The Offering Plate will continue to be available by the door of the Cathedral.

For now, the Sacrament will continue to be delivered in one kind at the head of the nave, but it is my intention to restore the common cup at the Eucharist in the Cathedral and all Souls' Chapel. I can assure you that to the best of my knowledge, there is no evidence of the transfer of any disease through the use of the common cup since it was introduced at the time of the Reformation of 1549. Each Sunday since I was ordained in 1983, I have, Sunday by Sunday and day by day, consumed any wine left over, after everyone present consumed the wine from the common cup, as have the clergy throughout the Anglican Communion, these many years, with no evidence of resulting illness. Of course, you may continue to receive in only one kind. The cup will be offered. You are not obliged to consume the wine.

May 23rd, 24th, & 25th ROGATION DAYS are days of prayer and fasting in Western Christianity. The word 'rogation' comes from the Latin verb *rogare*, meaning " to ask", which refers to Jesus teaching on prayer both in the Gospel read on Rogation Sunday, "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name he will give it you" and the Gospel read on the Rogation Days, "Ask, and it shall be given unto you". The faithful typically observed the rogations days by fasting and abstinence in preparation to celebrate the Ascension, and farmers often had their crops blessed by a priest at this time. A common feature of Rogation Days in former times was the ceremony of beating the bounds, in which a procession of parishioners, led by the priest, wardens and choirboys would proceed around the boundary of their parish and pray for its protection in the forthcoming year. The choirboys would be beaten at the boundary markers so that they would remember them.

May 26th ASCENSION DAY commemorates the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven. It is one of the ecumenical feasts (i.e. universally celebrated) of the Christian church, ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter, and of Pentecost. Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day after Easter. High Mass at 7:00 p.m.
