AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM FATHER DAVID GARRETT TO ST. PETER'S PARISHIONERS

Thursday, January 13th 2022 The Octave Day of Epiphany

Dear Friends in Christ,

A letter issued today by the Diocesan Bishop explains that no public worship is allowed in our Diocese, both in Prince Edward Island as well as Nova Scotia, at this time, because of the danger posed by the Omicron variant of the Covid 19 virus.

While the doors of the Cathedral and All Souls' Chapel will remain open for private prayer, the Sunday 10:30am Eucharist will continue to be broadcast online via our St. Peter's Cathedral YouTube channel, and the Daily Mass in the Chapel will now be broadcast online via Facebook, until public worship is again allowed. You may wish to access the very helpful online app* from The Prayer Book Society to support your daily devotions. The Bulletin will be circulated by email separately and will also be posted on the parish website.

In the meantime, please continue to follow the advice of our Public Health Office, wear a mask, keep a distance of 2 metres or 6 feet from anyone outside your household or close circle, wash your hands frequently. Please get vaccinated if you have not already done so.

Of course, we are all sorry about the current situation. The continuing pandemic has made almost everything difficult, school, work, human relationships as well as Christian Worship and Witness. These will change for the better someday soon. Let this be a time for reflection and renewal in God's grace. Please pray for one another, our Cathedral Church and me,

JANUARY 21st, AGNES OF ROME was born 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after and she had many high ranking men chasing after her. However, Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death. She died a virgin-martyr at the age of 12 or 13, 21 January 304.

JANUARY 22nd ST. VINCENT, DEACON AND MARTYR, the first martyr of Spain. According to legend, after St Vincent was martyred, ravens protected St Vincent's body from being devoured by vultures, until his followers could recover the body, which was taken to what is now known as Cape St Vincent; where a shrine was erected over his grave, which continued to be guarded by flocks of ravens.
