Dear Friends in Christ,

A letter issued today (Jan. 13) by the Diocesan Bishop explains that no public worship is allowed in our Diocese, both in Prince Edward Island as well as Nova Scotia, at this time, because of the danger posed by the Omicron variant of the Covid 19 virus.

While the doors of the Cathedral and All Souls' Chapel will remain open for private prayer, the Sunday 10:30am Eucharist will continue to be broadcast online as well as the daily Mass in the Chapel on the Cathedral YouTube channel until public worship is again allowed. You may wish to access the very helpful online app\* from The Prayer Book Society to support your daily devotions. The Bulletin will be circulated by email separately and will also be posted on the parish website.

In the meantime, please continue to follow the advice of our Public Health Office, wear a mask, keep a distance of 2 metres or 6 feet from anyone outside your household or close circle, wash your hands frequently. Please get vaccinated if you have not already done so.

Of course, we are all sorry about the current situation. The continuing pandemic has made almost everything difficult, school, work, human relationships as well as Christian Worship and Witness. These will change for the better someday soon. Let this be a time for reflection and renewal in God's grace. Please pray for one another, our Cathedral Church and me,

**JANUARY 25<sup>th</sup> THE CONVERSION OF SAINT PAUL** was, according to the New Testament, the event in the life of Paul the Apostle that led him to cease persecuting early Christians and to become a follower of Jesus. It is normally dated to AD 33-36. The Conversion of Paul, in spite of his attempts to completely eradicate Christianity, is seen as evidence of the power of Divine Grace, with “no fall so deep that grace cannot descend to it” and “no height so lofty that grace cannot lift the sinner to it.” It also demonstrates “God’s power to use everything, even hostile persecutor, to achieve the divine purpose.”

**JANUARY 26 - POLYCARP** (AD 69 - 155) was a 2nd-century Christian bishop of Smyrna. According to the *Martyrdom of Polycarp* he died a martyr, bound and burned at the stake, then stabbed when the fire failed to touch him.

It is recorded by Irenaeus, who heard him speak in his youth, and by Tertullian, that he had been a disciple of John the Apostle. Saint Jerome wrote that Polycarp was a disciple of John and that John had ordained him bishop of Smyrna.

With Clement of Rome and Ignatius of Antioch, Polycarp is regarded as one of three chief Apostolic Fathers. The sole surviving work attributed to his authorship is his Letter to the Philippians; it is first recorded by Irenaeus of Lyons.

**JANUARY 27 - JOHN CHRYSOSTOM** c. 349 – 407, Archbishop of Constantinople, was an important Early Church Father. He is known for his preaching and public speaking, his denunciation of abuse of authority by both ecclesiastical and political leaders, the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, and his ascetic sensibilities. The epithet Χρυσόστομος (Chrysostomos, anglicized as Chrysostom) means "golden-mouthed" in Greek and denotes his celebrated eloquence. His prayer concludes Morning and Evening Prayer in the Book of Common Prayer.
