Dear Friends in Christ,

A letter issued today by the Diocesan Bishop announces that in person public worship will be allowed in the Parishes of our Diocese on Prince Edward Island as of Monday, January 31st.

The doors of the Cathedral and All Souls' Chapel remain open for private prayer, and now also our Sunday worship in the Cathedral, 7.30 Matins, 8.00 a.m. Eucharist, 10:30 a.m. Eucharist in the Cathedral, 5.00 p.m. Evensong in the Chapel, as well as the regular schedule of daily worship, in the Chapel Monday to Saturday will welcome in person worshippers. The Sunday 10.30 Sung Eucharist will continue to be online. If you are at all hesitant to be present, you may wish to access the very helpful online app, <https://prayerbook.ca/common-prayer-app/> from The Prayer Book Society to support your daily devotions. The Bulletin is posted on the parish website.

Holy Communion will continue to be offered only in one kind, the Bread, but a significant change from Monday January 31st will be the manner of reception. The Celebrant will come to parishioners in their pews. Music is still limited to the Cathedral organ and one voice, the cantor.

In the meantime, please continue to follow the advice of our Public Health Office, wear a mask, keep a distance of 2 metres or 6 feet from anyone outside your household or close circle, wash your hands frequently. Please get vaccinated if you have not already done so.

Of course, we are all sorry about the current situation. The continuing pandemic has made almost everything difficult, school, work, human relationships, as well as Christian Worship and Witness. Let us give thanks for this renewed opportunity for grace.
