Dear Friends in Christ,

A letter issued last week by the Diocesan Bishop announces that in person public worship will be allowed in the Parishes of our Diocese on Prince Edward Island as of Monday, January 31st.

Our Sunday and Daily Mass schedule resumes this week. The doors of the Cathedral and All Souls' Chapel are open for private prayer every day.

The Sunday 10:30 Sung Eucharist will continue to be online each week. The Bulletin is posted on the parish website.

If you are at all hesitant to be present, you may wish to access the very helpful online app, that provides the Daily Prayer, Morning and Evening from the book of Common Prayer <https://prayerbook.ca/common-prayer-app/>

Holy Communion continues to be offered only in one kind, the Bread. The Celebrant will now bring the sacrament to parishioners in their pews. The Choir and Congregation may sing while wearing a mask.

In the meantime, please continue to follow the advice of our Public Health Office, wear a mask, keep a distance of 2 metres or 6 feet from anyone outside your household or close circle, wash your hands frequently. Please get vaccinated if you have not already done so.

FEBRUARY 11th Caedmon is the earliest English poet whose name is known. An Anglo-Saxon who cared for the animals at the double monastery of Whitby Abbey during the abbacy (657-680) of St Hilda (614-680), he was originally ignorant of “the art of song” but learned to compose one night in the course of a dream, according to the 8th-century historian Bede. He later became a zealous monk and an accomplished and inspirational Christian poet. His story is related in the “Ecclesiastical History of the English People” by Bede who wrote: “[t]here was in the Monastery of this Abbess a certain brother particularly remarkable for the Grace of God, who was wont to make religious verses, so that whatever was interpreted to him out of scripture, he soon after put the same into poetical expressions of much sweetness and humility in Old English, which was his native language. By his verse the minds of many were often excited to despise the world, and to aspire to heaven.”

Caedmon’s only known surviving work is *Caedmon’s Hymn*, the nine-line alliterative vernacular praise poem in honour of God which he supposedly learned to sing in his initial dream.

Now [we] must honour the guardian of heaven,
the might of the architect, and his purpose,
the work of the father of glory - as he the beginning of wonders
established, the eternal lord.
He first created for the children of men
heaven as a roof, the holy creator
Then the middle earth, the guardian of mankind
the eternal lord, afterwards appointed
the lands for men, the Lord almighty.
