

HELP THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE TODAY

The Primate's World Relief and Development Fund is a member of a Coalition of Churches in Canada and abroad, Anglican, Roman Catholic, Presbyterian, Orthodox, etc., supporting Ukrainians forced to flee their homes due to the Russian invasion, and offers humanitarian aid to those still in the Ukraine. The PWRDF has almost no **overhead** costs and deals directly with churches on the ground.

As the war began on February 24, tens of thousands of Ukrainians fled for safety elsewhere in Ukraine or to neighbouring countries. The Coalition of Churches had already shipped 28 tons of food to support those fleeing to Hungary, and their staff have been working with refugees at the Ukraine/Hungary border.

MARCH 25th ANNUNCIATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

is the announcement by the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary that she would conceive and become the mother of Jesus, the Son of God, marking his Incarnation. Gabriel told Mary to name her son Jesus, meaning "the Lord is Salvation."

According to Luke 1:26, the Annunciation occurred "in the sixth month" of Elizabeth's pregnancy with John the Baptist. Many Christians observe this event with the Feast of the Annunciation on 25 March, an approximation of the northern vernal equinox nine full months before Christmas, the ceremonial birthday of Jesus. In England, this came to be known as Lady Day. It marked the new year until 1752. The 2nd century writer Irenaeus of Lyon regarded the conception of Jesus on 25 March as coinciding with the Passion.
