Dear Friends in Christ,

A letter issued by the Diocesan Bishop announced that in person public worship will be allowed in the Parishes of our Diocese on Prince Edward Island as of Monday, January 31st.

Our Sunday and Daily Mass schedule has now resumed. The doors of the Cathedral and All Souls' Chapel are open for private prayer every day.

The Sunday 10:30 Sung Eucharist will continue to be online each week. The Bulletin is posted on the parish website.

If you are at all hesitant to be present, you may wish to access the very helpful online app, that provides the Daily Prayer, Morning and Evening from the book of Common Prayer <https://prayerbook.ca/common-prayer-app/>

Holy Communion continues to be offered only in one kind, the Bread. The Celebrant will now bring the sacrament to parishioners in their pews. The Choir and Congregation may sing while wearing a mask.

In the meantime, please continue to follow the advice of our Public Health Office, wear a mask, keep a distance of 2 metres or 6 feet from anyone outside your household or close circle, wash your hands frequently. Please get vaccinated if you have not already done so.

Pre-Lent

Today is the third Sunday of the three Sundays of the Season of the Church Year called Pre-Lent. This is the season of the “Gesimas”, that is, Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima, the Sundays that are respectively seventy, sixty and fifty days before Easter (approximately). In this season, there is a sort of “sea change” as we begin to turn our thoughts away from joyous celebrations of the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons, with their focus on the birth and manifestation of Christ, and toward the penitential season of Lent, with its focus on our Lord’s Suffering and death.

Throughout Pre-Lent and Lent, the singing or saying of “Alleluia” is omitted during our church services. In Pre-Lent, the colour of the liturgical vestments and altar frontal changes from green to purple, giving us a visual cue that it is time to begin to prepare ourselves for Lent, the season of penitence and self-examination, but also the season of hope, as we look forward to the resurrection of Christ at Easter.
