GOING FORWARD

Dear Friends in Christ:

While it is now possible to worship and to gather for meetings and coffee et cetera without capacity limits or masks in the Cathedral, please continue to sanitize your hands, to wear a mask or continue social distancing at your discretion. Please consider wearing a mask when moving in the aisle.

The Offering Plate will continue to be available by the door of the Cathedral.

For now, the Sacrament will continue to be delivered in one kind at the head of the nave, but it is my intention to restore the common cup at the Eucharist in the Cathedral and all Souls' Chapel. I can assure you that to the best of my knowledge, there is no evidence of the transfer of any disease through the use of the common cup since it was introduced at the time of the Reformation of 1549. Each Sunday since I was ordained in 1983, I have, Sunday by Sunday and day by day, consumed any wine left over, after everyone present consumed the wine from the common cup, as have the clergy throughout the Anglican Communion, these many years, with no evidence of resulting illness. Of course, you may continue to receive in only one kind. The cup will be offered. You are not obliged to consume the wine.

JUNE 11th BARNABAS THE APOSTLE (whose Christian name means *son of consolation*), was an early Christian, one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. According to Acts 4:36, Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. Barnabas is usually identified as the cousin of Mark the Evangelist on the basis of Colossians 4:10.

Named an apostle in Acts 14:14, he and Paul the Apostle undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against the Judaizers. They travelled together making more converts (c 45-47) and participated in the Council of Jerusalem c 50). Barnabas and Paul successfully evangelized among the "God-fearing" Gentiles who attended synagogues in various Hellenized cities of Anatolia, in what is now Turkey.

Barnabas' story appears in the Acts of the Apostles, and Paul mentions him in some of his epistles. Tertullian named him as the author of the Epistle to the Hebrews.

Although the date, place, and circumstances of his death are historically unverifiable, Christian tradition holds that Barnabas was martyred at Salamis, Cyprus in 61 AD. He is traditionally identified as the founder of the Cypriot Church.

This year the observance of St Barnabas' Day is transferred from its usual date of June11th and will be observed on Tuesday June 14th.

The Royal Canadian College of Organists (RCCO PEI Center) will perform a "Progressive" Concert on Sunday 26 June at three downtown Charlottetown churches. The concert will begin at 1:30 at St Peter's Anglican Cathedral (All Souls' Lane). After about 35 minutes of organ music, the performers and the audience will move to Trinity United Church (corner of Prince St and Richmond) where the second part of the concert will begin at 2:30. After another 35 minutes of organ music, the performers and audience will move to St Dunstan's Basilica for the final portion of the concert. This will begin at 3:30.

Admission is by free-will offering. All proceeds will go toward the Dr Alan Reesor Memorial Scholarship and used to encourage young area musicians to study the pipe organ.

The "Progressive" concert is a wonderful opportunity to sample the music of the "King of Instruments" performed by local organists, and also enjoy the beauty of three of PEI's historic churches. You are invited to attend all portions of the concert, or you can choose to attend only part. Regardless of your choice, you can anticipate a delightful afternoon of music.
