GOING FORWARD

Dear Friends in Christ:

It is now possible for us to worship and to gather for receptions and meetings, and gatherings such as coffee hour and lemonade on the lawn without capacity limited or other pubic health restrictions. Please feel welcome to wear a mask, sanitize your hands, and keep a distance at your discretion.

The Sacrament is delivered in one kind at the rail.

The offering plate is available at the door of the Cathedral during the Sung Eucharist and after.

It is my intention to resume administering the common cup at the Eucharist in the Cathedral and All Souls Chapel. I assure you that, to the best of my knowledge based on Science and Experience, that there is no evidence of transfer of any disease through the Common Cup since the restoration of the Common Cup in the Reformation in 1549. Each Sunday and Weekday since then the clergy have continued to drink the remaining wine after the reception of the Sacrament. And the Actuarial Tables of the insurance industry do not suggest an overly unusual number of clerical illness or death because of this. And I have not experienced in my years of ordination since 1983 any illness related to my consumption of the wine after the Communion. This has been the experience of clergy and lay people of the whole Anglican Communion of over 70 million people. The withdrawal was due to an overabundance of caution in 2020. The Covid-19 pandemic has sadly instilled fear of the Common Cup with no reason.

When this restoration of the Common Cup occurs and the cup is offered, and you choose not to receive the wine, I ask that you fold your arms and remain at the rail to hear the words of administration.

OCTOBER 28th SIMON and JUDE, THE APOSTLES. Apart from

their names in the Gospel, there is very little we know definitely about these two Apostles. Simon is called either the Canaanite or the Zealot (Mt. 10:4, Mk 3:18, Lk 6:15, Acts 1:13) by the evangelists to distinguish him from Simon Peter. Both titles come from the Hebrew *qana*, which means 'the zealous one'. After Pentecost, Simon, like several other Apostles, is not heard of again in the New Testament. However, there is an abundance of legends about his subsequent life and final martyrdom. One tradition affirms that he first preached in Egypt. He then joined his fellow Apostle Jude, who was in Mesopotamia, and they both went east to Persia. Here they were martyred at Sufian. In art Simon is usually symbolized with a boat or a falchion (an axe-like sword), allegedly the weapon by which heathen priests cut him down.

Jude, called "Judas, son of James", is mentioned by Luke in his gospel (Lk 6:16) and in the Acts (Acts 1:13) and also in John 14:22. He is believed to be the author of the Letter in the New Testament bearing his name. In more modern times, Jude has acquired the reputation as the 'patron of hopeless cases'. The origin of this devotion is said to be that no one would pray to him because his name was so like that of the traitor Judas Iscariot. Only people who had tried every other option would in desperation turn to him!
