NOVEMBER 30, ANDREW THE APOSTLE. The name "Andrew" is from the Greek *manly, brave*. He was the brother of Simon Peter, and likewise a son of John, or Jonah, born in the village of Bethsaida on the Sea of Galilee, where they fished for a living with their father. The Gospel of John (John 1:35-42) says that Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist, whose testimony first led him to follow Jesus. Andrew at once recognized Jesus as the Messiah, and hurried to introduce him to his brother. In the Gospel of Matthew (Matt 4:18-22) and in the Gospel of Mark (Mark 1:16-20), Simon Peter and Andrew were called by Jesus to become disciples and "fishers of men". Andrew is said to have been martyred by crucifixion on an X-shaped cross, at his own request, as he deemed himself unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus had been.

TIME, TALENTS AND TREASURES

Have you ever wondered what you could do to help out your parish and enjoy yourself along the way? Here is a list of some things going on at St Peter's.

There are rumours and worries about the pending departure (December 31st) of Mrs. Anne Chisholm, our long-time secretary. For 28 years, Mrs. Chisholm has been a central figure in the office and involved in many parish activities. (Bulletins for services, rental operations, Food Bank, Fund Scrip, Cemetery, ticket sales, Choir, phone and in-person inquiries, ordering supplies, financial administration, mail management, and a knowledge bank of operations.) We owe her a deep debt of gratitude for the decades of selfless service. Mrs. Chisholm has made many contributions to the health of our parish and fostered many friendships.

We thank Mrs. Chisholm for her service and wish her good health and happiness. She will certainly be missed.

Parishioners should also be aware of the background to the funding of the Cathedral Office Secretary position. For decades St. Peter's Cathedral (SPC) has enjoyed a beneficial relationship with St. Peter Publications (SPP), which includes the Anglican Planet publication. SPP is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors independent from St. Peter's Cathedral. SPC has provided office space for St. Peter Publications and shared the cost of Secretarial support (70% covered by SPP and 30% by SPC). This resulted in Mrs. Chisholm working four days per week and because she was so willing to help Parishioners left the impression with many that St. Peter's Cathedral had a full-time secretarial position.

The market for the materials produced by St. Peter Publications has been impacted by technology, changing times, and changing demands. These changes have necessitated St. Peter Publications reviewing its operations. Mrs. Chisholm is currently working four half-days per week until the end of the year.

SPP is meeting in the next few weeks to determine their future office requirements. It may be that an interim arrangement is required in January until the two organizations have a firm plan and the position filled.

St. Peter's Cathedral faces the task of planning for the future and striving to provide the consistent and numerous office services we have enjoyed because of the dedication of Mrs. Chisholm and our relationship with St. Peter Publications.

Vestry will work with St. Peter Publications to ensure appropriate staffing is in place for next year and beyond.
