Amabile Singers Concert

All are welcome to The Amabile Singers Concert, ‘Echoes from the Heart’, to be held at St Paul’s Anglican Church on Sunday, April 23, at 7:00 p.m. The program includes a variety of sacred and secular choral music, as well as instrumental selections performed by violinist Alix Lowe, and organist Clem Carelse. Director is Ruth Ann Read-Clay. Admission is by donation, with a portion of the proceeds going to those in need in our community.

APRIL 25th MARK THE EVANGELIST is the traditionally ascribed author of the Gospel of Mark. Mark is said to have founded the Church of Alexandria, one of the most important episcopal sees of Early Christianity. His feast day is celebrated on April 25, and his symbol is the winged lion.

In AD 49, about 19 years after the Ascension of Jesus, Mark travelled to Alexandria [Acts 15:36-41] and founded the Church there – today, both the Coptic Orthodox Church and the Greek Orthodox Church of Alexandria claim to be successors to this original community. Aspects of the Coptic liturgy have been attributed to Mark himself. Tradition says that he was martyred, on April 25th, in 68 AD.

Mark the Evangelist is most often depicted writing or holding his gospel. In Christian tradition, he is often symbolized by a lion – a figure of courage. Some Christian legends say that he was thrown to the Lions and the animals refused to attack or eat him. Instead the Lions slept at his feet while he petted them. When the Romans saw this, they released him, impressed by this sight.

“WHY?” “WHY BOTHER?” “WHY GATHER?”

“Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful; and let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.” (Hebrews 10:23-25)

As a result of the Dream Board Ideas provided by Island Parishioners at the Diocesan Church Society Fall 2022 Picnic, there have been many discussions and conversations regarding the question of “Why?”.

- Why do we want to welcome anyone into the church?
- Why is it important to enable the “ministry of all believers.”
- Why is it important to uphold and encourage one another in Christ.

To help to find the answers to these “Whys,” the Diocesan Church Society, of PEI, Anglican Clergy and People on the Island, with the support of the Diocese of NS & PEI will host a workshop with Author, Martha Tatarnic at St Paul’s Church, Charlottetown, May 6th 2023, 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Martha is the Rector of St George’s Church in St Catherine’s Ontario. Her book “Why Gather? The Hope & Promise of the Church” addresses our questions along with others. Martha will share with us the real stories of real people revealing how God shows up, who the church really is, and why the church matters as a response to our hurting world.

In the midst of a global crisis, Martha found herself in a crisis of vocation, wondering whether or not there might be something else she could do with her life, other than serve the church. The church as a whole began asking questions of a similar and urgent nature. Why be together in Jesus’ name? Does any of what we do as the church in gathering, in proclaiming, in serving, in being together, in not being together, does any of it matter?

The presentation is available in person and also through Zoom. We hope to see many Anglican Islanders join us in person for this wonderful opportunity.
