ASCENSION DAY 7:00 p.m. With the encouragement and guidance of our former Rector, Father Peter Harris, the Feast of the Ascension was observed in the Cathedral for over twenty years with an orchestral High Mass with much of the text in the Latin of the old Western Rite. We are grateful this year to the Reverend Clement Carelse, our Organist and Music Director, our Choir and Orchestra for a return this year of such a splendid liturgical witness to the Risen and Ascended Christ. We welcome Father Keith Kennific, Rector of St Dunstan's Basilica as our preacher. Father Garrett will serve as Deacon of the Mass and Father Colin Nicolle will serve as Subdeacon. Father Harris will be the celebrant. A reception will follow in the Cathedral Hall to which all are invited.

MAY 15th May 16th, May 17th ROGATION DAYS are days of prayer and fasting in Western Christianity. The word rogation comes from the Latin verb rogare, meaning "to ask", which refers to Jesus teaching on prayer both in the Gospel read on Rogation Sunday, "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name he will give it you" and the Gospel read on the Rogation Days, "Ask, and it shall be given unto you". The faithful typically observed the rogation days by fasting and abstinence in preparation to celebrate the Ascension and farmers often had their crops blessed by a priest at this time. A common feature of Rogation Days in former times was the ceremony of beating the bounds, in which a procession of parishioners, led by the priest, wardens, choirboys, would proceed around the boundary of their parish and pray for its protection in the forthcoming year. The choirboys would be beaten at the boundary markers so that they would remember them.

MAY 18th ASCENSION DAY commemorates the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven. It is one of the ecumenical feasts (i.e. universally celebrated) of Christian churches, ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter, and Pentecost. Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of Easter.

MAY 19th DUNSTAN, Archbishop (c.909-19 MAY 988) was an English bishop. He was successively Abbot of Glastonbury Abbey, Bishop of Worcester, Bishop of London and Archbishop of Canterbury, later canonised as a saint. His work restored monastic life in England and reformed the English Church. His 11th-century biographer Osbern, himself an artist and scribe, states that Dunstan was skilled in "making a picture and forming letters", as were other clergy of his age who reached senior rank. Dunstan served as an important minister of state to several English kings. He was the most popular saint in England for nearly two centuries, having gained fame for the many stories of his greatness, not least among which were those concerning his famed cunning in defeating the devil.
