## Holy Communion

If the rail is full to the middle please go as far to the left as possible before you kneel so that others will not have to walk over your legs.*

## **We Three Kings - Three Kings of Orient**

We three kings of Orient are,  
Bearing Gifts we traverse afar,  
Field and fountain, moor and mountain,  
Following yonder star.

**JANUARY 10th WILLIAM LAUD** 7 October 1573 – 10 January 1645 was a bishop in the Church of England. Appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by Charles I in 1633, Laud was a key advocate of Charles I's religious reforms. He enforced uniformity in the church of the liturgical practices outlined by the King, e.g. vestments and adherence to the Book of Common Prayer, described as High Church practices, by those who had given them up. He was arrested by Parliament in 1640 and executed towards the end of the First English Civil War in January 1645.

**JANUARY 12th BENEDICT BISCOP, ABBOT AND SCHOLAR** (c.628-690) was an Anglo-Saxon abbot and founder of Monkwearmouth-Jarrow Priory (where he also founded a famous library). In Benedict's lifetime he had seen the Church change from being divided between the Roman and Celtic Churches and threatened by a resurgent paganism to becoming a strong, united and growing English Church, united with the worldwide church.

**JANUARY 12th JOHN HORDEN, MISSIONARY & BISHOP** (January 20, 1828 - January 12, 1893) was the first Anglican Bishop of Moosonee, Canada.

**JANUARY 13th HILARY DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH and BISHOP OF POITIERS** c. 310 – c. 367 He was sometimes referred to as the "Hammer of the Arians". *Arian theology holds that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, who was begotten by God the Father with the difference that the Son of God did not always exist but was begotten/made before "time" by God the Father, therefore Jesus was not coeternal with God the Father, and the difference that Arius believed the Son to be "God" only in name.* Hilary's name comes from the Latin word for happy or cheerful i.e. *hilarious*. In addition to his important work as bishop, Hilary was married and the father of Abra of Poitiers, a nun and saint who became known for her charity.
