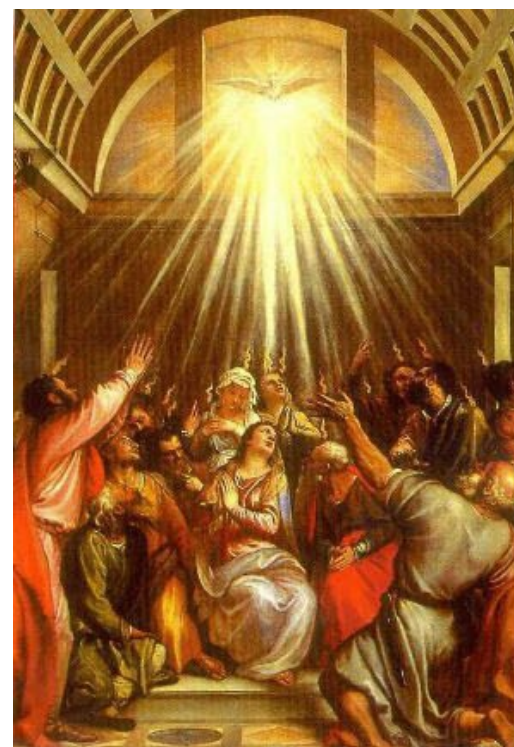

Please assist our sexton at the end of each service by picking up your kneeling cushion and placing it on the pew.

May 31, June 2 and June 3 EMBER DAYS are quarterly periods (Latin: quatuor tempora) of prayer and fasting in the liturgical calendar of Western churches. These fasts traditionally take place on the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday following St Lucy's Day (13 December), the first Sunday in Lent, Pentecost (Whitsun), and Holy Cross Day (14 September), though some areas follow a different pattern. Ordination ceremonies are often held on Ember Saturdays or the following Sunday.

May 29 and 30 - MONDAY and TUESDAY after Pentecost extend the celebration of Pentecost and emphasize its importance.

It Remains For Me to Say

The Memoirs of Archbishop Harold Lee Nutter edited by his son Andrew with a foreword by David Adams Richards.

A New Brunswick Anglican Archbishop with generational ties to PEI recorded his memoirs for the Provincial Archives of NB in 1992. He married Islander Edith Carew and for many years in the 50s and 60s the family summered at their cottage on the North River in Charlottetown.

Harold Lee Nutter was born in the small New Brunswick village of Welsford. His mother died of tuberculosis when he was nine. Unlike other boys of his age, interested in hunting and fishing, Harold began studying Greek at the age of twelve. His father, who ran the village grocery store, found his son's unusual interest difficult to explain to fellow villagers. The Archbishop was sounding alarm bells in the later part of his episcopate over the wayward and woke direction of his beloved church. His writings now seem prescient. His son, Andrew Bruce Nutter, was ordained here in St Peter's Cathedral. The book is now available from St Peter's Cathedral Office at \$28.
