

#### Pre-Lent

Today is the first Sunday of the three Sundays of the Season of the Church Year called Pre-Lent. This is the season of the "Gesimas", that is, Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima, the Sundays that are respectively seventy, sixty and fifty days before Easter (approximately). In this season, there is a sort of "sea change" as we begin to turn our thoughts away from joyous celebrations of the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons, with their focus on the birth and manifestation of Christ, and toward the penitential season of Lent, with its focus on our Lord's Suffering and death. Throughout Pre-Lent and Lent, the singing or saying of "Alleluia" is omitted during our church services. In Pre-Lent, the colour of the liturgical vestments and altar frontal changes from green to purple, giving us a visual cue that it is time to begin to prepare ourselves for Lent, the season of penitence and self-examination, but also the season of hope, as we look forward to the resurrection of Christ at Easter.

# **BENEDICTION**

According to Article XXV OF THE SACRAMENTS, of the 39 Articles of Religion, Book of Common Prayer page 708, "The Sacraments were not ordained of Christ to be gazed upon, or to be carried about, but that we should duly use them."

Much of our worship e.g. the order, the prayers, the use of hymns, the vestments, architecture, is not specifically "ordained of Christ" but nonetheless serves the purpose of conveying Christ to the believer

The church father Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem, 350-386 A.D. describes the manner of receiving the sacrament, to the newly baptized, using all of the senses, 'In approaching therefore, come not with thy wrists extended, or thy fingers spread; but make thy left hand a throne for the right, as for that which is to receive a King. And having hollowed thy palm, receive the Body of Christ, saying over it, Amen. So then after having carefully hallowed thine eyes by the touch of the Holy Body, partake of it; giving heed lest thou lose any portion thereof."

Devotions surrounding the blessed sacrament, at times outside of the celebration of Holy Communion, e.g. at Evensong, do not replace the proper use of the sacrament, but provide a moment of meditation, touching the eyes and the heart of the believer with the blessing of Christ, whose presence is signified in the holy mysteries of the Eucharist.
