#### IT REMAINS FOR ME TO SAY

The Memoirs of Archbishop Harold Lee Nutter edited by his son Andrew with a foreword by David Adams Richards

A New Brunswick Anglican Archbishop with generational ties to PEI recorded his memoirs for the Provincial Archives of NB in 1992. He married Islander Edith Carew and for many years in the 50s and 60s the family summered at their cottage on the North River in Charlottetown.

Harold Lee Nutter was born in the small New Brunswick village of Welsford. His mother died of tuberculosis when he was nine. Unlike other boys of his age, interested in hunting and fishing, Harold began studying Greek at the age of twelve. His father, who ran the village grocery store, found his son's unusual interest difficult to explain to fellow villagers. The Archbishop was sounding alarm bells in the later part of his episcopate over the wayward and woke direction of his beloved church. His writings now seem prescient. His son, Andrew, was ordained here in St Peter's Cathedral. The book is now available from St Peter's Cathedral Office at \$28.

The year 2022 has come to a close and we are faced with Annual Report time. **Our Annual General Meeting is set for Sunday, March 12, 2023, following the 10:30 a.m. service. Please prepare your report now and submit it to the Cathedral Office as soon as possible.**

### Pre-Lent

Today is the second Sunday of the three Sundays of the Season of the Church Year called Pre-Lent. This is the season of the “Gesimas”, that is, Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima, the Sundays that are respectively seventy, sixty and fifty days before Easter (approximately). In this season, there is a sort of “sea change” as we begin to turn our thoughts away from joyous celebrations of the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons, with their focus on the birth and manifestation of Christ, and toward the penitential season of Lent, with its focus on our Lord’s Suffering and death. Throughout Pre-Lent and Lent, the singing or saying of “Alleluia” is omitted during our church services. In Pre-Lent, the colour of the liturgical vestments and altar frontal changes from green to purple, giving us a visual cue that it is time to begin to prepare ourselves for Lent, the season of penitence and self-examination, but also the season of hope, as we look forward to the resurrection of Christ at Easter.

Weekly Paragraphs for the Holy Sacrament By Austin Farrer

### SEXAGESIMA

ST PAUL glories in his heroic sufferings; looking back on them, he would not be without them. Some of them are splendid and dramatic, but others of them, even in retrospect, are boring and miserable: appeasing Jewish spite or neutralising Christian treason, sitting up when he was dropping with sleep, working on when he was tired and longed to stop. Besides his own burdens, there are everyone else’s” Who is sick at heart and I am not sick, who falls from grace and I do not die of shame? He takes his friends into his heart, both for good and for evil, and in this above all he may justly glory. It is the living out of our unity with Christ, that we should care for one another with the heart of Christ, and by our prayers throw ourselves into the deepest concerns of our friends. Let us not offer this holy sacrifice without praying for some other man, as though we were that man himself. It is an excellent thing, indeed, often to say all the prayers of the eucharist in the place and person of another man saying them; being that man in God’s sight, so far we know how.
