SEPTEMBER 21st MATTHEW THE APOSTLE, among the early followers and apostles of Jesus, Matthew is mentioned in Matthew 9:9 and Matthew 10.3 as a publican who, while sitting at the "receipt of custom" in Capernaum, was called to follow Jesus. Matthew may have collected taxes from the Hebrew people for Herod Antipas.

September 20, 22 & 23 are Ember Days which are quarterly periods (Latin: quatuor tempora) of prayer and fasting in the liturgical calendar of Western churches. These fasts traditionally take place on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday following St Lucy's Day (13 December), the First Sunday in Lent, Pentecost (Whitsun), and Holy Cross Day (14 September), though some areas follow a different pattern. Ordination ceremonies are often held on Ember Saturdays or the following Sunday.
