Homecoming Sunday

Today at St. Peter's Cathedral we are once again observing "Homecoming Sunday" – an annual parish event that was interrupted by Covid. Today's event has been planned and coordinated under the guidance and leadership of our Parish Life Committee.

SEPTEMBER 29: MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS. Michael means *'Who is like God?'*, Saint Michael the Archangel. Michael is mentioned three times in the Book of Daniel. In the New Testament, Michael leads God's armies against Satan's forces in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 12, where during the war in heaven he defeats Satan. In the Epistle of Jude, Michael is specifically referred to as "the archangel Michael". Saint Michael is depicted in the window nearest the front door of All Souls' Chapel. On the Feast of Michael and All Angels, popularly called Michaelmas, we give thanks for the many ways in which God's loving care watches over us, both directly and indirectly, and we are reminded that the richness and variety of God's creation far exceeds our knowledge of it.

SEPTEMBER 30: JEROME c.347 - 30 September 420) was a Latin priest, confessor, theologian, and historian. He is best known for his translation of most of the Bible into Latin and his commentaries on the Gospels. Jerome is recognized as a saint and Doctor of the Church. He is often represented as one of the four Latin doctors of the Church along with Augustine of Hippo, Ambrose, and Pope Gregory, as he is in All Souls' Chapel.
