OCTOBER 4th FRANCIS OF ASSISI was an Italian mystic and friar who founded the Order of Friars Minor or Franciscans. He was inspired to lead a life of poverty as an itinerant preacher, which was the pattern of life adopted by the Franciscans. He is usually depicted in a brown habit with a rope around his waist with three knots, symbolizing the three Franciscan vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. In 1219, he went to Egypt in an attempt to convert the sultan al-Kamil and put an end to the conflict of the Fifth Crusade. In 1223, he arranged for the first live nativity scene as part of the annual Christmas celebration in Greccio. According to Christian tradition, in 1224 Francis received the stigmata, the wounds of the crucified Christ, in a religion ecstasy.

OCTOBER 6th WILLIAM TYNDALE was an English biblical scholar and linguist who is best known as a translator of the Bible into English. One estimate suggests that the New Testament in the King James Version is 83% Tyndale's words, and the Old Testament 76%. He opposed Henry VIII's plan to seek the annulment of his marriage to Catherine of Aragon on the grounds that it contravened scripture. In 1536, he was convicted of heresy and executed by strangulation, after which his body was burnt at the stake.
