JULY 20th MARGARET OF ANTIOCH, in what is now Turkey, is celebrated as a saint by the Roman Catholic and Anglican Churches, on July 20, and on July 17 in the Orthodox Church. Her historical existence has been questioned for lack of evidence. She was declared apocryphal by Pope Gelasius I in 494, but devotion to her continued in the East and revived in the West with the Crusades.

According to legend, she was the daughter of a pagan priest named Aedesius. Her mother having died soon after her birth, Margaret was nursed by a pious woman, five or six leagues from Antioch. Having embraced Christianity and consecrated her virginity to God, she was disowned by her father, adopted by her nurse and lived in the country, keeping sheep with her foster mother. Olybrius, Governor of the Roman Diocese of the East, asked to marry her but with the price of her renunciation of Christianity. Upon her refusal she was cruelly tortured, and put to death in A.D. 304, during the persecution of the Church by the Emperor Diocletian.

JULY 22nd MARY MAGDALENE travelled with Jesus as one of his followers. Within the four Gospels she is named at least 12 times, more than most of the apostles.

She is most prominent in the narrative of the crucifixion of Jesus, at which she was present. She was also present two days later, immediately following the Sabbath, when, according to the Gospels, she was the first to testify to the resurrections of Jesus, as well as the first person to see Jesus after his resurrection and so she was called by the early church, “Apostle to the Apostles”, The One Sent to The Ones Sent.
