Progressive Organ Concert

The Royal Canadian College of Organists presents a Progressive Organ Concert on Sunday, June 25th at various churches throughout Charlottetown. The first half hour concert starts at 1:30 p.m. at St Peter's Cathedral, followed by a second concert segment at 2:30 p.m. at St Paul's Anglican Church, finishing with a 3:30 concert at St Dunstan's Basilica. Adequate time will be given to walk between churches and concerts. Admission is by free will offering and supports the Reesor Scholarship Fund for aspiring organ students.

JUNE 11th BARNABAS THE APOSTLE (whose Christian name means *son of consolation*), was an early Christian, one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. According to Acts 4:36, Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. Barnabas is usually identified as the cousin of Mark the Evangelist on the basis of Colossians 4:10.

Named an apostle in Acts 14:14, he and Paul the Apostle undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against the Judaizers. They travelled together making more converts (c 45-47) and participated in the Council of Jerusalem c 50). Barnabas and Paul successfully evangelized among the "God-fearing" Gentiles who attended synagogues in various Hellenized cities of Anatolia, in what is now Turkey.

Barnabas' story appears in the Acts of the Apostles, and Paul mentions him in some of his epistles. Tertullian named him as the author

of the Epistle to the Hebrews.

Although the date, place, and circumstances of his death are historically unverifiable, Christian tradition holds that Barnabas was martyred at Salamis, Cyprus in 61 AD. He is traditionally identified as the founder of the Cypriot Church.

This year the observance of St Barnabas' Day is transferred from its usual date of June11th and will be observed on Tuesday June 13th.

2023 Atlantic Theological Conference: "The Idea of the Parish" St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, PEI, June 26 - 29, 2023

This year, we will be hosting the annual Atlantic Theological Conference here at St. Peter's Cathedral. This Conference will examine the roots of parish life and will invite us to consider the challenges that face parishes today and the possibilities that lie before us.. An initial list of speakers and paper topics includes: The Immanence of Scripture, the Catholicism of the Local Church, and the Lectionary – Fr Benjamin von Bredow; The Benedict Option: The Anglican Prayer Book Parish – The Rev'd Dr Gary Thorne; Uniting the Highest and Lowest: The Sacramental Life According to E.B. Pusey and the Oxford Movement – The Rev'd Dr George Westhaver; The Parish in Literature: Imagining Community – Dr Marilyn Orr; The Parish: A City on the Hill for Cats, Dogs, and Humans Too – The Rev'd Canon Chris VanBuskirk; Conference Summary – Amy Bird. A conference book club session will be led by Shannon Parker-Nicolle on the novel, "The Dean's Watch", by Elizabeth Goudge.
