Ascension Day Eucharist (High Mass) May 17, 7:30 p.m.

Parishioners are asked to take careful note of this information about our Ascension Day worship. This year Ascension Day will be Thursday, May 17. Here at St. Peter's Cathedral, we have had a long-standing tradition of celebrating Ascension Day in a very special way with a High Mass in which the musical portions of the Mass are sung in Latin by the choir. This has been taking place ever since Ascension Day 1992. Most years, the music was accompanied by a small orchestra of four instruments. PLEASE NOTE - Unfortunately, this year we will not be able to observe Ascension Day in this way. Due to illness among the choir members, the choir has not had sufficient time to prepare the special music for the Latin Mass, and also the choir is short of sufficient soprano soloists for this year. Nonetheless, a High Mass with beautiful music is still planned for Ascension Day and we hope that our parishioners will make an effort to attend. For the Mass Setting, the choir will sing "Mass in F Major" by Charles Wood. There will be a Latin motet "Viri Galilaei" by Dulos Couillart, and the service will include the singing of familiar Ascension Day hymns. Ascension Day is an important holy day in the church calendar. Please mark this date on your own calendar now and plan to attend.

Father Ralph Moore to become part-time Assistant at St. Peter's Cathedral

On Sunday, April 15, Father Harris announced that the new Rector of the Parishes of Milton and Rustico will be the Rev'd Father Ralph Moore. This is of special significance to our parish, because of the plan that has been in place for the last number of months that the next Rector of Milton/Rustico would be a part-time position (2/3) with the other one-third of his time serving as Assistant Priest at St. Peter's Cathedral and in the Parish of Georgetown. (The "Parish of Georgetown" means the Anglican Parish in King's County, and includes congregations in Montague, Souris, and Georgetown).

Negotiations regarding this arrangement began a year ago. It has been a long process—planning how this arrangement would work, making the necessary plans, financial and otherwise, and of course searching for a suitable candidate, a priest who would be acceptable to all four parishes concerned with their different traditions and practices.

Here at St. Peter's Cathedral, we will be delighted to welcome Father Ralph Moore back to PEI. It will be a pleasure to have him with us once again. (He was a very active lay member of our parish for ten years, before being ordained and serving in the Diocese of Western Newfoundland). Let us indeed keep Father Ralph and his wife Bonnie in our thoughts and prayers, as he prepares to leave his parish in St Anthony Newfoundland and to move to PEI in late June. His appointment is effective as of July 1st.

Cemetery Committee Notes

Last year was a busy but productive year for Committee members as they assessed the condition of St. Peter's Cemetery and began introducing ways and means of improving it. Perhaps the most significant outcome of the Committee's work was the development of a set of guidelines for the maintenance and general operation of the cemetery; a copy of the Guidelines can be found on the Cathedral web site. The general response to initiatives taken by the Committee in 2011 has been very positive and members hope to make further improvements in 2012.

The Cemetery Committee, like most other Cathedral committees, struggles with a shortage of funds and as a result many hard decisions have to be made about priorities. Historically, funding for the operation of the Cemetery has come from the investment income generated by the dedicated trust fund, commonly referred to as the Cemetery Endowment Fund. In the past, most parishioners and friends of St. Peter's have donated to the Endowment Fund through regular giving and special gifts, often in memory of loved ones.

More recently, parishioners and friends who wished to support the maintenance of the cemetery in a more direct way have directed their donations to the operating budget. The Committee appreciates very much all donations made in support of cemetery maintenance and hope that contributors see marked improvements as we go forward.
