

## Travelling Organ Concert Today June 22, 2025

The Royal Canadian College of Organists (PEI Centre) will present their annual Progressive Organ Concert today, Sunday, June 22nd. Enjoy music performed by local organists, including our own Ann Francis, Clem Carelse and Gloria Jay, on the “King of Instruments as the concert travels between three of Charlottetown’s beautiful historic churches:

- 1:30 – St Paul’s Anglican Church (101 Prince St)
- 2:30 – Trinity United Church (Corner of Prince and Richmond)
- 3:30 – St Dunstan’s Basilica (Great George Street)

Each concert will be 30-40 minutes and admission will be by free-will offering. Proceeds will go toward the Dr. Alan Reesor Memorial Scholarship and will be used to encourage young area musicians to study the pipe organ. You may choose to attend one, two, or all three portions of the concert. Regardless of your choice, you can anticipate a delightful afternoon of music.

## Finance Warden Message to Parishioners

Dear Parishioners,

As we close in on the first day of summer, and the halfway mark of our financial year, I’d like to provide a brief update on our financial status.

The bottom line is that we are well behind where we were last year at this time with a deficit at the end of May of \$37, 400. That’s an increase in deficit of \$20,000 compared to this time last year.. Envelope revenue received by May 31 was \$36,315 compared to \$55, 644 last year, so this is the bulk of the shortfall. Overall expenses to date are actually slightly lower at \$128,648. Contributions to Friends of St. Peter’s were down \$3000 to \$12,010. at the end of May.

As you will recall, we have been balancing our books consistently for many years, with small deficits in last two. We can’t afford to return to running deficits.

We have a new chimney top on the Rectory in advance of installing a badly-needed new roof, to be completed this year. We do have the funds set aside in our Building Fund for this, but the Building Fund can also always use your support.

So I would ask that everyone please check that your very important contributions to the Cathedral or Friends of St Peter’s are up-to-date and keeping up with inflation where possible.
