SEPTEMBER 13th CYPRIAN converted to Christianity in the mid-240s AD and eventually became a Bishop of Carthage. He led the North African Church through periods of persecution under Emperor Decius and was eventually martyred by beheading in 258 AD during the reign of Emperor Valerian. He is remembered as a significant Christian theologian, a martyr, and a doctor of the Church, known for his writings on themes like charity, martyrdom, and Church unity.

SEPTEMBER 14th HOLY CROSS DAY

Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to search for the Holy places significant in the life of Christ to make the point of the reality of the incarnation, e.g. what many believed to be the empty tomb and true cross of Christ during at Jerusalem. Jerusalem. According to tradition, the discovery was made on September 14th, 330.

SEPTEMBER 16th NINIAN was a British-born bishop and Christian missionary, credited as the first to evangelize the Picts and the first bishop of Galloway in what is now Scotland.

SEPTEMBER 17th 19th 20th. EMBER DAYS These days are a traditional Christian observance of fasting, prayer, and thanksgiving, meant to offer spiritual intention as the seasons change, giving thanks for the harvest and praying for priests and vocations.

SEPTEMBER 19th THEODORE OF TARSUS, ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY Theodore of Tarsus was Archbishop of Canterbury from 668 to 690. Theodore grew up in Tarsus, but fled to Constantinople after the Persian Empire conquered Tarsus and other cities. After studying there, he relocated to Rome and was later installed as the Archbishop of Canterbury.
