BENEDICTION AND EVENSONG: ST. MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS: Michael means 'Who is like God?', Saint Michael the Archangel. Michael is mentioned three times in the Book of Daniel. In the New Testament, Michael leads God's armies against Satan's forces in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 12, where during the war in heaven he defeats Satan. In the Epistle of Jude, Michael is specifically referred to as "the archangel Michael". Saint Michael is depicted in the window nearest the front door of All Souls' Chapel. On the Feast of Michael and All Angels, popularly called Michaelmas, we give thanks for the many ways in which God's loving care watches over us, both directly and indirectly, and we are reminded that the richness and variety of God's creation far exceeds our knowledge of it. Please consider attending the special Evensong and Benediction next Sunday evening, in observance of the Eve of St. Michael's Day.

Reading The Scriptures with The Church...
Daily Psalms and Lessons appointed for this week
Following The Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity, 2025

SEPTEMBER 21st MATTHEW THE APOSTLE is mentioned in Scripture as a tax collector who, while sitting at the "receipt of custom" in Capernaum, was called to follow Jesus. According to tradition, he was also one of the four Evangelists as author of the Gospel of Matthew, and thus is also known as Matthew the Evangelist.

SEPTEMBER 25th LANCELOT ANDREWES lived during the reigns of Elizabeth I and James I. During the latter's reign, Andrewes served successively as Bishop of Chichester, of Ely, and of Winchester and oversaw the translation of the King James Version of the Bible (or Authorized Version)

SEPTEMBER 29th MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS

The Archangel Michael is considered as the greatest of all the angels; being particularly honored for defeating Lucifer in the war in heaven (*Revelation 12*), as depicted in a window in our chapel.

According to Scripture an angel is a supernatural spiritual being who serves God. Angels are often depicted as benevolent intermediaries between God and humanity. Other roles include protectors and guides for humans, such as guardian angels. While angels are spiritual beings that do not have bodies, they are depicted in art usually shaped like humans of extraordinary beauty because they communicate with human beings. They are often identified with wings, because they represent the presence of God in every place much as birds in flight, and have halos because they shine with the light of holiness.

from The Crown of the Year by Austin Farrer, weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament. Jesus broke the bread of the Supper into as many pieces as there were disciples present. Peter took one piece, John another and so on until there was none of it remaining. He gave his mysterious body away to his friends without remainder and without reserve, for that was the principle of his life. He also said to his disciples, 'Give, and it shall be given unto you.' But I do not find that I give myself away as he gave himself away. I find that I am jealously keeping my life for myself, stealing this and that part from my neighbour and from God, making up little closed packets of pleasure and pride. 'Give, and it shall be given to you'. If we could once for all give ourselves away, be perfectly at the disposal of God and of men, Jesus would fully give himself to us.
