OCTOBER 4th FRANCIS of ASSISI was an Italian mystic and friar who founded the Order of Friars Minor or Franciscans. He was inspired to lead a life of poverty as an itinerant preacher, which was the pattern of life adopted by the Franciscans. He is usually depicted in a brown habit with a rope around his waist with three knots, symbolizing the three Franciscan vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience.

In 1219, he went to Egypt in an attempt to convert the sultan al-Kamil and put an end to the conflict of the Fifth Crusade. In 1223, he arranged for the first live nativity scene as part of the annual Christmas celebration in Greccio. According to Christian tradition, in 1224 Francis received the stigmata, the wounds of the crucified Christ, in a religious ecstasy

OCTOBER 6th WILLIAM TYNDALE was an English biblical scholar and linguist who is best known as a translator of the Bible into English. One estimate suggests that the New Testament in the King James Version is 83% Tyndale's words and the Old Testament 76%. He opposed Henry VIII's plan to seek the annulment of his marriage to Catherine of Aragon on the grounds that it contravened scripture. In 1536 he was convicted of heresy and executed by strangulation, after which his body was burnt at the stake.

OCTOBER 9th SAINT DENIS OF FRANCE According to tradition he was the first bishop of Paris and was martyred for his faith by decapitation under the persecution of the emperor Decius shortly after AD 250 Tradition claims that the decapitated bishop picked up his head and walked several miles while preaching a sermon on repentance.

OCTOBER 10th PAULINUS, was a Roman missionary and the first Archbishop of York. A member of the mission sent by Pope Gregory I to Christianize the Anglo-Saxons. He arrived in England by 604.

from The Crown of the Year by Austin Farrer, weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament. Christ taught us to pray for daily bread in saying the Pater Noster, and added some comments to the prayer. He taught that for the very reason that God is our Father and we his family, it is fitting that we should seek our bread from his hand. We say the Pater Noster in this sacrament, remembering how Christ went from the Last Supper straight to Gethsemane, and prayed to his Father there in the spirit of a true Son. Abba, Father, he said, asking for the wholesome bread of life if he could have it, but willing to receive the bitter cup of death and shame if it was his Father's will. St. Paul says that it is the Spirit of Sonship, overflowing from Christ to us, which speaks in our hearts when we say Our Father. We kneel with Christ in Gethsemane to say that prayer, and even then it is not truly said unless Christ says it in us through the Holy Ghost.
