WELCOME FATHER RALPH MOORE

We have received correspondence from Bishop Sandra Fyfe confirming the appointment of The Reverend Ralph Moore as Priest-In-Charge for St. Peter’s Cathedral, effective October 18, 2025, until June 30, 2026. This will cover The Reverend Canon David Garrett’s period of leave as he moves towards retirement.

In this role as Priest-in-Charge, Fr. Ralph will provide oversight of the Parish, including the coordination of a worship schedule with Parish leaders and area clergy. Fr. Ralph will be the first point of contact for pastoral emergencies and will be available to preside at funerals and weddings, as needs arise, or will arrange for clergy to offer leadership.

The service schedule will be published in the bulletin. Initial plans include regular Sunday services and a mass on Wednesday.

We welcome Fr Ralph back to St Peter's and we are most grateful to him for his spiritual and pastoral care and leadership while we begin the process of identifying a new Rector for our Cathedral.

Parish Wardens

OCTOBER 28th SIMON and JUDE are two of the least known Apostles. The Gospel names St. Simon as the tenth apostle, just before Jude. When the eleven dispersed from Jerusalem to proclaim the Kingdom of God in other lands, tradition says that Jude departed from Galilee and Samaria to go into Syria, Armenia and ancient Persia where he met Simon, and their missionary partnership won tens of thousands for Christ. As always, the Gospel earned for itself both followers and enemies: for the two Apostles, the hour of supreme witness eventually arrived. Arrested and taken to the Temple of the Sun, the sentence imposed on both was to worship the goddess Diana, and so to deny Christ. In refusing, it is said that Jude declared pagan idols false, and that at the same time two horrible demons came out of the temple, destroying him. Frightened, the people watching the scene are said to have pounced ferociously on the two Apostles, who were brutally killed.

from The Crown of the Year by Austin Farrer, weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament. St Matthew’s story of the paralytic abbreviates St Mark’s account. St Mark’s fuller story reads like a burial-scene. The paralytic is helpless as the dead, he is carried out like the dead by his four bearers; a hole is opened for him, as for the dead, and he is lowered into it, as into his grave. But, falling, he does not fall into clay, he falls before the feet of the Son of God, who says to him first ‘Thy sins are forgiven thee’ and then ‘Arise and walk’. Jesus is by his own death the forgiveness of our sins; he is the resurrection and the life through his own resurrection. We are thrown into the life-giving sepulchre of Christ, we touch the slain and living Christ, his body and his blood; our sins are forgiven us, and we live by him; we arise to walk in all those good works that he has prepared for us to walk in.
