

## **Question Box**

### **How is Jesus the Son of God?**

The Bible has two large chapter books, the Old Testament and the New Testament. In the Old Testament, God told the Hebrew people that He would send His Son to them. In the New Testament, Jesus is born in a very special way with God as His father.

One day after He had grown up and become a man, God sent His Spirit down from the sky as a dove. When the dove landed on Jesus, the voice of God from heaven told the people, "This is my beloved Son."

Jesus did many special things like healing sick people and teaching about God, and after He was killed on the cross, He came back to life and gave more teachings to his followers. So people have known that Jesus is very important and we should listen to what He teaches us about God and heaven and how to behave as good people.
