Question Box Question:

Does this parish offer sacramental confession? What is the reasoning behind it?

Yes, sacramental confession is available at St. Peter's Cathedral.

Why Confess Sins directly and privately to a Priest?

After his resurrection, our Lord entrusted the Apostles with a ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation. In John 20:23 we read: "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Anglicans understand this ministry to continue in the Church through the Apostolic succession of its ordained priests. Although we confess our sins together in the General Confession at the Eucharist, private confession offers an opportunity to name particular sins honestly, receive pastoral counsel, and hear personally the absolution and assurance of Christ's forgiveness.

The priest does not forgive by personal power or merit. Rather, the priest declares God's forgiveness in Christ and exercises the Church's ministry of reconciliation. Private confession is not a requirement of Anglicans, but it is available to any who seek it. As a traditional Anglican saying goes: "All may, some should, none must." Father Ralph
