Question: Why is a pillar of your faith the practice/goal of converting as many people as possible?

Answer: The Church's practice and goal of bringing people to Christ is to follow our Lord's command to make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, and teaching them to observe all things that he has commanded us. (Matthew 28:19–20)

Then, as Christians, we are to live out the faith that has been handed down to us through the Apostles and the saints; to worship the Father through the Son, in the Holy Spirit; to love God and our neighbour; and to make disciples of others.

Our Lord has given us both commands and knowledge:

1. I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. (John 14:6)
2. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. (Matthew 28:19)
3. Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you. (Matthew 28:20)
