NEW DOORS: Installation of the Cathedral's new main doors is complete. Designed and built specifically for the Cathedral by a small Charlottetown business, they were installed by local craftspeople. This project enhances the Cathedral while supporting young Islanders who are preserving traditional woodworking skills common when the Cathedral was built. The doors will also reduce heat loss and include panic-bar hardware to meet code requirements.
