## Cruise Ship Tour Coordinator

St. Peter's Cathedral is one of a group of three churches involved in a walking tour offered by Experience PEI to cruise ships visiting Charlottetown.

The tours are sold on board in cooperation with the cruise lines. Not all Cruise lines participate.

Tours go ahead based on sufficient sales as determined by the Cruise ship.

High demand may result in a second tour being offered and churches would be advised in advance.

Many dates there is only one tour, some days have two and occasionally there are three tours.

The tour season usually starts in May and continues until November. The majority of tours take place in the fall - late August until late October.

Tours range in size from a half dozen participants to 20.

Tours are met at the wharf and escorted by an Experience PEI guide to the three churches involved (St. Peter's, Kirk of Saint James, Saint Dunstan's Basilica).

St. Peter's is usually the first stop on the tour.

At the church the group is met by a volunteer host and given an overview of the history and special features of the property.

Location visit runs about 20 minutes.

The churches receive a per-person payment for the tours. The payment is made electronically by Experience PEI to the Cathedral.

## Duties

### **Tour coordination:**

- Liaison with Experience PEI regarding tour dates and times.
- Experience PEI will provide a list of planned tour dates and times. This must be checked to ensure there are no conflicts with church services or events.
- Tours are confirmed by text 48 hours in advance.

### **Cathedral:**

- Recruit volunteer tour hosts.
- Produce a chart of tour dates, including Day, Date, Time departing wharf, Arrival time St. Peter's, the on-site host.
- Update script each year.
- Arrange host for each visit.
- Advise Clergy, Altar Guild, Choir director, Office and Sextons of tours. (usually a month at a time).

### **Hosts:**

- Be on site prior to tour arrival.
- Offer commentary on the property. (General script provided)
- Answer questions.
