Appointment of New Rector

Bishop Fyfe has announced the appointment of The Reverend Colin Nicolle as Rector for the Parish of St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, effective November 16, 2026.

Fr. Colin was ordained deacon in 2016 and priest the same year in our diocese. Following ordination, Fr. Colin was appointed Rector of the Anglican Parish of St. Mary and St. John (Summerside and St. Eleanors), where he has served faithfully for the past ten years. He has also served as Priest-in-Charge for the Parish of Alberton and O'Leary for the past year and a half. As a student he spent three summers serving at St. Peter's and over the years has participated in special services.

He holds a Bachelor of Journalism degree and a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of King's College, Halifax, and a Master of Divinity from the Atlantic School of Theology.

Fr. Colin is known for his dedication to ministry and active community involvement. He chairs the Summerside & Area Christian Council, advocates for transitional housing for men and women in Summerside, volunteers with Arts & Culture Summerside, and serves as a Beaver leader with Scouts Canada. He enjoys encouraging people of all ages to grow in their faith and take part in the life of the church.

We look forward to Fr. Colin and his wife Shannon joining the St. Peter's family and community.

Cemetery Sunday at St. Peter's

When is Cemetery Sunday?

August 9 we will hold our usual 10:00 eucharist service in the cemetery.

Where is the St. Peter's Cemetery?

Out St. Peter's Road heading east, across the street from the Fair Isle Ford dealership and beside Sam's Restaurant. The service takes place well back down the lane. You'll barely see us from the street but we're back there.

Where can I park?

You can park along the road and walk down the cemetery lane. Or, if you have reduced mobility, you can have someone drop you off down back or park down at the back of the cemetery.

What is different about this service?

The service is essentially the same communion service as when we're in the church. The choir is there and will lead us in music. The celebrant will read off the names of any parishioners who have died in the past year and we sing the beautiful Russian Cantakion of the Departed. Other than that, it's the same lovely service but in a beautiful setting. A little more simplified with no organ.

What happens if it's inclement weather? The service will be moved back to the church.

Do you need help setting up? Good question. Feel free to ask Thomas Haslam if they could use some help.

Is there anything special to consider? If it's a sunny day you may want to wear a sun hat or shawl or put on sunscreen as it can be bright that time of day. Otherwise, just come and enjoy!
